Harewood Medical Practice – your health is our priority

We are an NHS practice based in Catterick Garrison providing the full range of GP practice services as well as a minor injury unit open to anyone, whether registered here or not.

Our GPs have a range of clinical skills and specialisms and you are welcome to choose to see whichever you feel happiest with. We also have Advanced Nurse Practitioners who, the same as the GPs, can diagnose conditions, issue prescriptions and refer patients to hospital consultants.

We offer appointments on the day for patients who need to be seen and we operate a telephone triage system to facilitate this. This helps us to make sure we can see those who need to be seen urgently. We also have the usual range of face-to-face appointments where patients can come down to the surgery and see the doctor or nurse. We also offer telephone appointments; a lot of conditions can be dealt with on the phone which we hope is convenient for patients.



Patient Participation Group (PPG)

Harewood Medical Practice PPG is run by patients for patients and acts as a link between the practice and its patients. The group exists to give patients a voice in the organisation of their care, to give feedback on patients' needs, concerns and interests and to support communication within all areas of the practice. Meetings are held every six weeks at the practice, usually in the evenings.

Better Access to GP services

Better Access is an NHS England funded service designed to provide access to primary care services outside of normal GP surgery opening hours. It is run throughout Hambleton, Richmondshire and Whitby by our local GP Federation, Heartbeat Alliance, who are providing evening sessions during the week and Saturday morning sessions covering services such as:

- GP appointments
- Nurse Practitioner appointments
- Practice Nurse appointments
- Physiotherapy.

Ordering medication

You can get a repeat prescription by:

- Placing a repeat prescription request form (ie the green tear off slip on the reverse of your prescription) into the red repeat prescribing box in reception or posting it to us
- Ordering via your online account (see above)

If you do not have a repeat request form, please ensure that your name, address and the items you require are clearly indicated in your note/letter.

Please note that 48 hours' notice is required for repeat prescription requests.

Dr Stephen Wild



Preparing for a visit or stay in hospital — Information for patients with memory problems and their carers

A stay in hospital can be worrying and stressful so South Tees Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust has put together a leaflet with information and advice for patients and their carers. It contains:

 Space for you to write down important information such as the date, time and location of your appointment as well as the contact name/number so that you have all the information in one place.

Ex-Forces support in North Yorkshire

Ex-Forces Support North Yorkshire is rolling out a range of services aimed at raising awareness of the issues faced by older and ex-members of the armed forces and enabling them to lead fuller lives.



You are eligible for our support if you used to serve in any branch of the armed forces – for whatever amount of time – or if you completed National Service. You can also access support if you were employed in the Merchant Navy to support the military at any time. You must be 65 years old or older.

- Support to keep warm, safe, and maintain independence
- Opportunities to take part in new activities or revisit old hobbies and interests
- Befriending and home visits
